




behaviour, enthusiasm, commitment etc.

under the roof. We estimate that this will costs £17K and quotes are now being obtained with the assistance of Doug Eburah, our Church architect, and of course we have to seek approval to do this work.

What progress...! Included with this newsletter is a flyer from the FoSJ and we hope that many of you will want to become Friends of St James' and join us as we strive to conserve the Church for our children and in fact many future generations to come.

We were delighted with the attendance to the Concert by the University of Warwick Chamber Choir who sang superbly and helped us raise over £600 for the FoSJ conservation appeal.


